ASP Ship Management Singapore EET EXPANSION

ASP Ship Management Singapore has strengthened its managed fleet with the addition of two bulk carriers, Diamond Star II and Arwen Gemini, under full technical management. This expansion underscores ASP's commitment to operational excellence and efficiency in global ship management.

Diamond Star II

On October 19, 2024, ASP Shipmanagement assumed full technical, management of the *Diamond Star II* (IMO No. 9449273), a Supramax bulk carrier registered in Panama. The vessel was taken over at Singapore anchorage, marking a significant milestone in ASP's growing portfolio.

To ensure a seamless transition, all crew members attended a oneday seminar at ASP's Singapore office on October 17, 2024. The takeover team included Capt Suyash Panse as Master and Mr. Ratan Sharma as Chief Engineer with Ship Manager Shravan Jha and Marine Superintendent Capt Anant Sapra overseeing the vessel's operations.

Arwen Gemini

On January 29, 2025, ASP Shipmanagement took over the management of the Arwen Gemini (IMO No. 9594925), a Kamsarmax bulk carrier registered in Singapore. The handover took place at Cape Town anchorage, further strengthening ASP's global presence in ship management.

Prior to the takeover, the crew participated in a pre-handover seminar on January 28, 2025, ensuring a smooth transition. The Arwen Gemini is now under the command of Capt Ruwan Maya Kaduwage with Mr V. Thiruvendra Kumar as Chief Engineer. Asit Pradhan as the Ship Manager and Marine Superintendent Capt Anant Sapra are overseeing its management.

We extend our sincere gratitude to the owners of Diamond Star II and Arwen Gemini for their trust in ASP. The addition of these vessels highlights our dedication to delivering operational excellence in the maritime industry. As the maritime industry continues to evolve, strategic partnerships are essential for enhancing operational efficiency and service delivery. In a significant move that highlights their commitment to collaboration, Langh Ship has entrusted ASP Crew Management with an expanded fleet.

Building on their existing relationship, which includes the management of five crew managed vessels, Langh Ship solidified this alliance by entrusting ASP Philippines with the crew management of the vessel *MS Greta* on December 18, 2024. This marks the beginning of a series of additional vessel entrustments throughout 2024-2025, including the transfer of *MS Edith* on April 30, 2024, and *MS Christina* on May 30, 2024. These actions reflect the growing trust Langh Ship has in ASP.

This gradual approach allows ASP Crew Management to seamlessly integrate these vessels into its management framework, ensuring a smooth transition and continued operational excellence.

In addition to these entrustments, Langh Ships is expanding its fleet with newly constructed vessels, further enhancing ASP Philippines crew management capabilities. The new built vessel *MS Lovisa* was taken over on October 23, 2023, followed by *MS Olivia* on January 17, 2024, and *MS Sofia*, which joined the fleet on March 30, 2024.

MS Lovisa was the first vessel in the series of three 7800 dwt multipurpose new-buildings for Langh Ship. *Lovisa* is equipped with Wärtsilä dual fuel engine able to burn in addition to traditional MGO and LNG also biodiesel and biogas.

Looking ahead, the partnership between Langh Ships and ASP is set to strengthen even further. Notably, *MS Ingrid* has been taken over by ASP on March 11, 2025.

This partnership is characterized by a shared vision of operational excellence, sustainability, and innovation within the maritime industry. As they collaborate to manage a growing fleet, both organizations are committed to upholding the highest standards of safety, efficiency, and environmental stewardship.

With a robust fleet expansion plan and a focus on innovative vessel management, both companies are well-equipped to navigate the challenges and opportunities ahead, ensuring a prosperous future for their operations and the industry as a whole. ASP Group is profoundly grateful to Langh Ships for their continued trust and support as we look forward to taking over more vessels in the future.

As of today, Langh Ship offers trustworthy and efficient sea transportation service. The modern fleet of Langh Ship is capable of operating in challenging Northern conditions transporting steel, bulk



and container goods. All Langh vessels are equipped with hybrid scrubbers. Langh Ship is proud of the fact that also Connecting Europe Facility of the European Union has trusted the innovative technology and co-financed part of the scrubber project "Back from Black".

A BULLETIN OF INDUSTRY SAFETY ISSUES

Mooring fatality

Excerpt from MARS Report No 202511, 26 February 2025

Providing learning through confidential reports – an international co-operative scheme for improving safety.

As edited from MAIB (UK) report 18/2024

Under pilotage, a bulk carrier was coming alongside a berth for loading. As they approached, the pilot explained to the Master the required manoeuvres. Two tugs would assist with the berthing operation. The vessel would be moored port side to the berth with two springs and four head/stern lines forward and aft, respectively.

Once the vessel was alongside with the first springs fore and aft fastened, the port control advised the pilot that the vessel needed to move 30m astern to align with the cargo loading arm. The Master instructed the mooring party crews accordingly. The vessel's engine control was set to dead slow astern, and it began to move back, eventually reaching a speed of 0.5 knots. During the manoeuvre, the forward mooring party heaved in the slack on the forward spring and the aft deck mooring party slackened the aft spring.

A few minutes later, the officer in charge of the aft mooring party positioned himself near the accommodation ladder and looked over the side rail directly above the slack spring line while using a VHF radio. At that moment, the spring line tightened, then slackened and then came under tension once more. A loud bang was heard as the line suddenly released and recoiled vertically upwards.

The officer was struck under his chin by the recoiling spring line. He was lifted and thrown backwards, his head striking the accommodation ladder behind and above his former position.

The victim was found lying in a pool of blood and the alarm was raised. Within seconds, medical assistance was requested from the port and the tugs directed to hold the vessel alongside. The port's medical team boarded quickly, but the victim was pronounced deceased at the scene.

The investigation found, among other things, that:

- As the vessel moved astern under its own power the aft spring line became trapped on the dock fendering.
- As the line tensioned and the vessel momentarily moved away from the jetty, the line released (like a bow string) upwards at an estimated speed of 65km/hr leaving the victim minimal opportunity to move out of its path.
- The use of engines while running lines is generally avoided during mooring operations to reduce the risks of mooring lines being drawn into a rotating propeller or rapid tensioning of a line.

- The terminal's mooring procedure specifically stated that there should be no ship running manoeuvres, implying that a vessel should not use its engines while positioning alongside. It is probable that the Master of the vessel was unaware of this requirement because a copy of the terminal mooring procedure had not been provided.
- Given that vessel's engines were apparently often used while manoeuvring alongside berths at this port, it is also probable that the pilots had not been provided with the mooring procedure either.

Points to learn:

- This accident is reminiscent of MARS 201870 where the victim, also at the aft mooring area, looked overboard to gain a better view and was struck by the released spring under tension.
- This accident is testament, once again, to the dangers of mooring work. Be aware of your environment and the potential hazards.
- The energy within mooring ropes can easily injure or kill.
 Always use extreme caution when working within the mooring area.
- If there is no clear, unimpeded path from fairlead to bollard, beware of increased tension in the line. If necessary, slacken the line until the obstruction has been cleared.

Lockout

Excerpt from MARS Report No 202512, 26 February 2025

A crew member was told to verify the steering light on the forward mast while the vessel was under way. Before ascending the mast, the crew member radioed the bridge to inform the 00W and request that the Lock Out Tag Out (LOTO) tag be put on the bridge foghorn activator. The Master was also on the bridge and, as he went to the bridgewing, he remembered there were also foghorn activators there.

He informed the OOW and LOTO tags were installed on those activators as well.

Points to learn:

- Lockout/Tagout (LOTO) is an important procedure that can only be truly effective if both the 'lockout' and the 'tagout' have been completed. In this case, only the 'tagout' was accomplished.
- Putting 'tagout' signs on an activator may be reassuring, but this action alone does not prevent the stored energy from being accidentally released. This practice surreptitiously undermines the goal of LOTO which is to prevent 100% of accidents related to accidental energy release.

ARROW DOCKING

Prior to commencing a new charter for DFDS operating from Portsmouth to the Channel Islands in UK, the owners, Isle of Man Steam Packet Co. agreed to drydock the vessel early, to give an uninterrupted service during the charter. UK Docks, Teesport, UK had capacity available and the docking was stemmed for beginning of March. The vessel departed from Douglas, where *Arrow* had been on standby for the Heysham Douglas operation.

The vessel arrived on schedule for docking on the 5^{th} of March. Due to high winds, the docking was postponed until the 6^{th} and was then successfully docked without incident.

The main work consisted of a main and one shaft generator cleaning and servicing, routine main engine bearing inspections and the renewal of the port propeller hub seals. A 24-month hull paint schemed was applied and the freshwater tank coating repaired. Some hydraulic and other piping renewals were also completed. Bowthruster and main propeller blades were polished and checked.

The vessel undocked on 25th March, on schedule to arrive in Portsmouth to start her first voyage to Jersey on the 27th March. The vessel has operated on this service to date with no issue.

New additions to NORTADA

Expansion of Nortada Shipmanagement Fleet with New Container Carriers

Following the successful takeover of M/V *Pros Hope* in March 2024, Nortada Shipmanagement has further expanded its fleet with two additional container carriers. 

INTERVIEW:

Aleksandr Tayunov

An interview with Aleksandr Tayunov, General Manager of ASP Ukraine, about crew management operations in Odesa during the ongoing invasion.

How did you and your team manage to maintain operations during such a challenging time?

Despite the ongoing war and all the difficulties that time has prepared for us, our team remained fully operational from our office in Odesa. To continue working, we were forced to quickly adapt to new realities, implementing contingency measures such as using alternative power sources during power outages and ensuring stable communication channels with our seafarers, clients, management office in Singapore and ASP branch offices worldwide. Close cooperation with our partners allowed us to maintain the steady supply of qualified seafarers for bulkers, container ships, tankers, and Ro-Ro cargo vessels as per requirements, ensuring minimal disruption to our daily operations.

What were some of the biggest challenges you faced while continuing to meet operational demands?

One of the main challenges was ensuring operational continuity amid frequent power outages, internet disruptions, travel restrictions and safety concerns.

An insidious and ruthless war came to Ukraine. Thanks to the Ukrainian Armed Forces, the situation in Odesa and the surrounding regions remains stable and under control. However, constant attacks on critical local and port infrastructure continue to pose challenges for our region and the country as a whole.

From the first day of this merciless war, our office has not stopped working for a single day. We have accepted the challenges that harsh reality has thrown at us and have continued to support our seafarers and their families, providing employment opportunities on our clients' ships with decent working conditions and wages.

How did the local infrastructure and logistics challenges impact your operations, and what solutions did you implement to overcome them?

The war has had an impact on transportation, document processing, and general infrastructure. To address the challenges, we optimized remote communication, secured alternative power sources, and worked closely with our clients and partners to streamline travel and documentation processes for our seafarers.

Our priority is to ensure crew changes remained as smooth as possible under the current circumstances.

How did the geopolitical situation affect your recruitment and staffing processes, both locally and internationally?

The war has made recruitment more complex due to travel restrictions, visa difficulties, and security concerns. Some seafarers have faced challenges in obtaining necessary documents and uncertainty about their ability to join vessels.

Despite these geopolitical challenges, Ukrainian seafarers remain highly sought after in the global maritime industry. Thanks to the united support of the entire maritime community and the efforts of the Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine, they continue to have opportunities for employment on vessels with decent working conditions. The extended and crucial support of shipowners today helps ensure stable employment for qualified Ukrainian seafarers during this difficult time.

How did you manage to keep morale high among your team and crew during such uncertain and dangerous times?

Morale is a crucial factor in tough times. We have developed a strong team spirit through clear communication, mutual support, and a shared sense of purpose. Maintaining a stable workflow, and acknowledging the efforts of our staff and seafarers have helped keep motivation high. Knowing that our work directly supports the livelihoods of seafarers and their families has given us the strength to keep going.

We have unwavering faith in our country and its future, and we will continue to do everything in our power to contribute to the prosperity and well-being of Ukraine and its seafarers.

The war in Ukraine created massive challenges for Ukrainian seafarers and their families. Despite the crisis, Marine Transport Workers' Trade Union of Ukraine continue to support its members and provide all possible social, humanitarian and legal support.

Protecting Rights & Elevating Standards


Filipino Seafarers is a landmark legislation that outlines the rights and responsibilities of Filipino sailors, including their qualifications, employment terms, and education and training requirements. Republic Act (RA) 12021 is designed to safeguard the welfare of domestic and overseas Filipino seafarers while promoting their full employment through a comprehensive framework that enhances their rights and overall well-being in both local and international shipping sectors.

This legislation marks a significant milestone for the Filipino seafaring industry, aiming to elevate the country's renowned maritime heritage. It seeks to enhance training and competencies, improve living standards both on-board and ashore, and strengthen protections for crew claims.

On November 5, 2024, and January 30, 2025, ASP Crew Management Services participated in a forum organized by the Filipino Association for Mariners' Employment (F.A.M.E), the Joint Manning Group (JMG), and the Associated Marine Officers and Seamen's Union of the Philippines (AMOSUP).

The forum attracted a diverse audience, including seafarers, manning agencies, maritime organizations, legal experts, the maritime press, and government representatives, particularly from the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW), the primary agency overseeing the law's implementation.



Somnath Chatterjee - Vessel Performance Manager


Mr. Somnath Chatterjee has joined the ASP Ship Management Singapore team as the Vessel Performance Manager on 1st November 2024.


